Main Highlights For The Year 2021-22

- Completed merger of ALERT Academy into TMA in February 2022 which brought in assets worth over Rs. 45 Lakhs into TMA.
- Conducted the first ever Women In Business Conclave (WIBC) in March 2022.
- Launched the TMA youth wing named Young Leaders of Thrissur (YLT) in April 2022.
- Conducted the first ever Students Conclave in June 2022.
- Launched socially relevant projects for the first time - Waste Management, development of Vilangan Hills Masterplan, and Industrial Mentoring.
- Expanded the TMA student chapters in an unprecedented way – with 20 chapters comprising 1606 members. The expansion is ongoing.

- Launched health related initiatives like covid vaccination drive and walkathon.

► Revision of Logo, and Vision & Mission Statements

The inspiration for the new logo was drawn from the image of two elephants facing each other in front of the Vadakkunathan temple during Pooram – a festival that is almost synonymous with Thrissur. Digitization and Standardization of Publicity Material

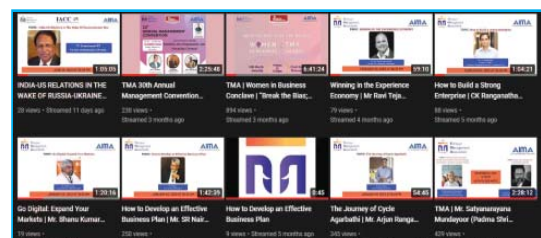

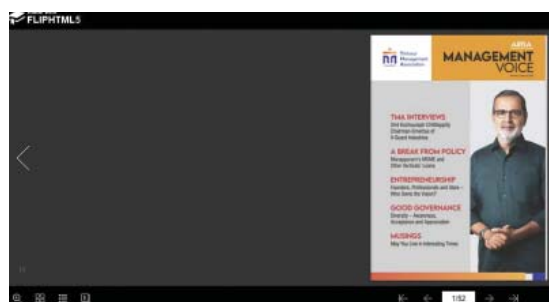

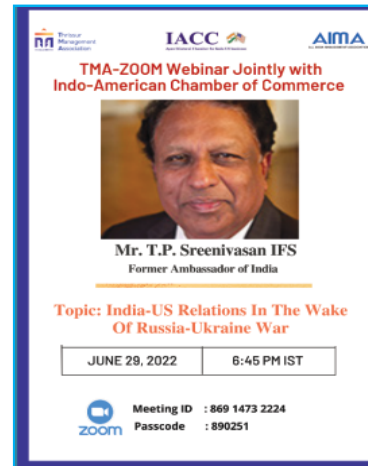

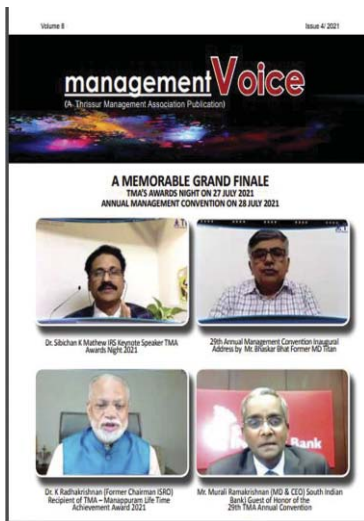

► Tourism Development – Vilangan Hills Masterplan

As a follow up to the first Let's Chat meeting organized at Vilangan hills in October, the TMA team had collated a list of suggestions for improvement of Vilangan hills as a tourist attraction. The requirement that stood out most to be addressed was the haphazard development at the place using annual government grants. It was strongly felt that a master plan had to be developed to bring about consistency in the design and development done at Vilangan hills in future, and to plan a development schedule against it. The TMA team headed by the president met with the District Collector on the 7th of December and subsequently obtained the permission of the District Collector in her capacity as the chair of District Tourism Promotion Council (DTPC) to develop a master plan for Vilangan hills.

Accordingly, TMA ran a contest during the months of April and May for the young architects and engineers of Thrissur to develop a master plan. Prizes were given to the best three submissions. Furthermore, a TMA expert team worked closely during the month of June with DTPC and the winner of the first prize, Aihikam, to further fine-tune and finalize the master plan. The final master plan was submitted to the office of the Minister for PWD and Tourism, Govt. of Kerala, Mr. Mohamed Riyas, and the District Collector of Thrissur, Ms. Haritha V in July 2022.

Industrial Mentoring

The idea that TMA members who have expertise in various fields could mentor struggling industrial units was shared by the TMA president, Er. Vinod Manjila with Mr. P. Rajeev, the Minister for Industries, Law, and Coir, in the Kerala govt. in a workshop organized by the District Industries Centre (DIC) on the 7th of September. 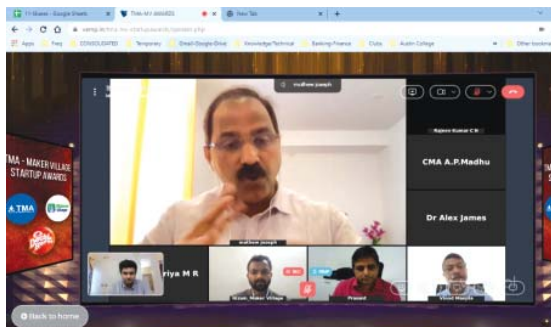

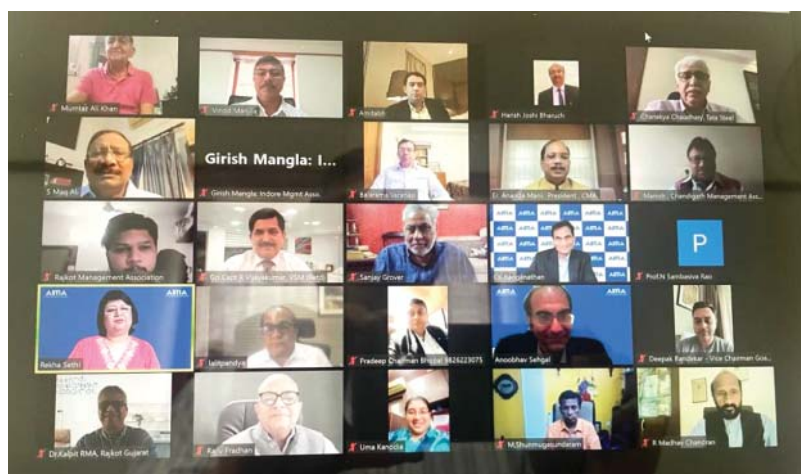

Report on the audit of the financial statements

Opinion

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of THRISSUR MANAGEMENT ASSOCIATION, which comprise the Balance sheet as at March 31, 2022, the Income and Expenditure Account and Receipts and Payments Account for the year then ended, and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

General

Thrissur Management Association was registered as a Society under the Travancore-Cochin Literary, Scientific and Charitable Societies Registration Act 1955 (Act 12 of 1955) on 26-03-2014. 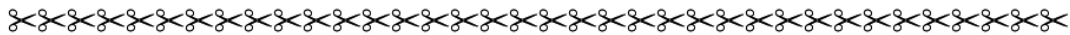
